





Athens to Aegina

12 miles – 2 hours. The Saronic Gulf area is known for light winds from the south in the spring and from the north in the summer.

Day 1: Saturday

Saturday is best spent touring the many sites and museums in Athens.

Arrive at Alimos Kalamaki Marina for boarding at 16:00hrs.

Your Catamaran cabin is waiting for you from 16:00 hours in Alimos Marina. Alimos a suburb south of Athens, 30 km from the Athens airport.

You will be welcomed on board by your crew and unpack in your designated cabin.

Departure is at 18:00 to Agia Marina bay on Aegina. Agia Marina bay is located 15 miles from Alimos marina for your first evening under the stars! It's also walking distance to the Temple of Aphaia up the hill.



Dinner: Enjoy dinner onboard while anchored in Agia Marina.





Athens to Molos Beach, Hydra

30 miles – 4 hours. The Saronic Gulf area is known for light winds from the south in the spring and from the north in the summer.



Day 2: Sunday

AEGINA: After breakfast on board, enjoy a morning swim or take advantages of watersports on board (paddle, kayak, snorkeling). An optional morning excursion: Temple of Aphaia by taxi (10min drive) or an energetic hike up the hill trail (35mins). This temple, dates from the 5th century BC and stands majestically on a ridge offering a superb view of the surrounding sea,. Entrance to the temple is not included (approx. 8 € / pax).

HYDRA: Sail to Molos Beach on Hydra island, a secluded bay where the yacht is anchored for the night. Optional late afternoon excursion: visit famous Hydra town, by water taxi (12 mins). This tiny Venetian town was once the largest trading centre in all of Greece during the sponge trade. More recently it has become a fashionable artist hang-out full of art galleries, great jazz bars and divine restaurants all set in a place that allows no roads or cars - only flip-flops or donkeys to get around! At one time there were said to be 500 trading vessels calling tiny Hydra port their home. The Hydra sailors contributed significantly with their kamikaze 'fireships' in the Greek War of Independence (1821). There are 300 churches and 6 monasteries across the island connected by footpaths, as well as the canons, statues of War heroes and fortified areas which preserve the rich history of this truly unique Greek island.



Dinner: Enjoy dinner onboard while anchored in Molos Beach.



Molos Beach, Hydra - Dokos island - Spetses

16 miles – 2.45 hours Motor sailing along the coastline.

Day 3: Monday

HYDRA DOKOS ISLAND: After breakfast on board enjoy a morning sail to uninhabited Dokos island for a swim in picturesque Skintos bay. After lunch enjoy some watersports in this huge open bay which offers clear water and shelter from most all winds. Little known Dokos is the resting place of the oldest known shipwreck (700BC) excavated from the depths from 1989-1992.

SPETSES: In the afternoon sail to historic Spetses island, also famous for its significant contribution to the 1821 War of Independence. It was here that the revolution flag was first flown on 3rd April 1821. Famous for wooden ship building, which is practiced to this day around the narrow creek, the islands mansions bear witness to it's glorious past. One particular mansion is a must see museum stop as it was the home of Admiral Bouboulina, who was hugely influential liberating Greece and is in history books as one of the only female admirals in world history. Before dinner aboard take horse-drawn carriage tour around the tiny place and soak in the layers of history.



Dinner: Enjoy dinner onboard while anchored in in the harbor at Spetses.





Spetses to Ermione

12 miles – 2 hours.



Day 4: Tuesday

Ermione: After breakfast sail to Ermioni with a stop for swimming and lunch at Aghios Emilianos. Ermioni is a picturesque village of about 1500 people set at the base of a beautiful peninsula covered with pine trees, giving it an island vibe. Take the mile-long hike around the peninsula with private cove swim stops and incredible vistas looking east out in the afternoon haze to Dokos and Hydra islands. Later stop in at one of many little port-side pubs and enjoy a cold Greek lager in a frosted mug, and watch the busy harbour with yachts docking up for the evening festivities ashore!

Ermione to Poros

24 miles – 4 hours

Day 5: Wednesday

POROS: After breakfast sail to Poros Island with a stop at Soupia bay for swimming, water sports and lunch. Entering the bustling harbour of Poros is always a treat. There is easily a billion dollars of yachts tied up around the 1.2 miles promenade each afternoon. It is amazing to walk the promenade and see every type of vessel from 200 private motor yachts displaying Bahamian flag and respiration to solo sailors in tiny 24ft tubs. Poros is a great place to shop for souvenirs and there is a small Archaeological Museum with artifacts from the Mycenaean Period (1600 – 1100 BC) including finds from ancient shipwrecks from the Saronic Gulf area. Enjoy a panoramic sunset up at the historic Clock tower then after dinner take a leisurly stroll along the promenade



Dinner: Enjoy dinner onboard while anchored in the harbor at Poros.





Poros – Palaia Epidaurus

24 miles – 4 hours.



Day 6: Thursday

EPIDAUROS: Motor early to Love Bay or Russian Bay, minutes from Poros harbour, for breakfast and a swim close to Poros harbour. Later motor sail to famous Epidaurus, cruising past Methana for a lunch and swim stop at Aghios Georgios. Ancient Epidaurus or Palaia (old) Epidaurus, is a tiny charming port on the Peloponnese coast which feature rolling hills full of overloaded orange trees. It is also the access point, by taxi, to go and visit the largest ancient amphitheater in Greece, the 14000 seat-capacity ancient Epidaurus amphitheater where they still feature music and live theatre performances.



Dinner: Enjoy dinner onboard while docked in Epidaurus.



Palaia Epidauros to Alimos Marina, Athens

30 miles – 5 hours

Day 7: Friday

Wake up to breakfast aboard and enjoy a morning swim at the lovely little beach, or visit the small 200 seat ancient theater minutes from the harbour. If there is time pick some fresh oranges in the hills as the farmers will tell say they have too many! For lunch, the yacht anchors at picturesque Agistri island, in a beautiful bay protected by numerous small islands. Enjoy this last opportunity of snorkeling, paddle boarding or kayaking.

ATHENS: In the afternoon, the yacht heads for the home port at Alimos marina to dock before dinner. After dinner head up by taxi to Athens and explore the wonderful pedestrian Plaka area or jewelry, tourist shops, art galleries and bars all nestled under the majestic columns of the Parthenon high atop Acropolis hill.
